

KATIKATI PRIMARY SCHOOL

ENROLMENT SCHEME

Effective from 25 September 2017

The guidelines for development and operating of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Starting at western boundary of 441 Woodland Road, the zone boundary travels south along the eastern foot of the Kaimai-Mamaku Forest Park to 834 Wright Road and includes all addresses on Aongatete Lodge Road.

From there, the zone boundary travels north along Wright Road, including addresses on both sides of the road. At the intersection of Wright Road and Upland Road, the zone boundary then travels north-east to continue further along Wright Road. Addresses on Midland Lane and Pine Ridge Lane are included in the zone. The zone boundary then continues along Wright Road to the intersection with State Highway 2 (also known as Tauranga West Road). It crosses State Highway 2 (Tauranga West Road) and travels along the northern bank of the Aongatete Stream to the coast line.

The zone boundary then travels north, following the coast line, to 1054 State Highway 2 (also known as Katikati North Road). Addresses on Bridgman Lane are excluded from the zone.

From 1054 State Highway 2 (Katikati North Road), the zone boundary travels south along State Highway 2 (Katikati North Road), including addresses on both sides of the road and all addresses on Wolseley Road, Canon Road and Hikurangi Road.

From the western boundary of 35 Hikurangi Road, the zone boundary travels west to meet the eastern foot of the Kaimai-Mamaku Forest Park at 441 Woodland Road, including all addresses on both sides of Woodland Road.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will be specific a date by which all applications must be received.

Special Programmes

The school operates the following special programme:

- Māori immersion class (Whare Putake)

2 August 2017.*

Students who live within the school's home zone and meet the criteria for enrolment in the special programme will be enrolled ahead of out of zone students.

The criterion for acceptance into the programme is that Katikati Primary School is the nearest, suitable immersion option for students who either:

- have been to kohanga reo, puna reo or who are transferring from another rūmaki or bilingual unit, or
- are coming from an immersion environment at home, or
- are coming from a home where whānau are making a long term commitment to Māori immersion education.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

- **First priority** must be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in the following special programme(s) run by the school and approved by the Secretary for Education: Māori immersion class (Whare Putake).
- **Second priority** must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
- **Third priority** must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- **Fourth priority** must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- **Fifth priority** must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- **Sixth priority** must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary. Under Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
