Promoting Well Being

Based on our community consultation last year, one of our strategic aims for 2024 and 2025 is *Promoting wellbeing for all.* We have already made a start on this goal. **Our first focus is on making the children's transition to school in the morning calm** and positive. Our teachers will be introducing a soft start for the children. This means that when the children arrive in the morning there will be a range of activities for them choose to take part in. The teachers will use this time to check in with the children and set them up for the school day.

One of our Teacher Only Days before the children returned to school was focussed on the impact of stress on children's ability to learn and what can be put in place to support children. We will be working throughout the year with Lynda Knight de Blois. The focus for this professional learning will be: understanding how the brain deals with stress/ trauma; how best to support our children; and how to enhance systems and processes to increase resilience and children's ability to understand and regulate their feelings. Later in the year Lynda will run a session for families to give you a clear understanding of the work we are doing and to provide ideas for use at home.

A New Face in The Office

Our wonderful Odette is taking a term's leave so we have a new face in the office. We are very pleased to welcome Jen Evans who will be filling in for the term. If you are around the school, please take time to pop into the office and say hi.

Family Picnic and Hauora Evening - 4.00 till 6.00pm.

5.30pm classrooms will be open so you can pop in and meet your child's teacher before heading to the back field for a picnic. Children are expected to go home before the event starts. Please be aware there will be no supervision between the finish of school and 4pm. If you would like to make a more formal appointment to speak to the teacher, they will have their diaries available to set a date and time. The picnic will be an informal event, you are welcome to bring your own food and drink. There will be a free sausage sizzle. The event will be weather dependent. A decision on whether the event will run or not will be made on the 19th February. We hope you will be able to join us on the evening.

Life Ed Starts

Harold, the Life Education Giraffe, will be back at Katikati Primary School from the 26th February for Teams 1 and 2. For any families who don't already know, Life Education is a programme which supports our health curriculum. The Life Education caravan will be parked on site outside the school hall. The lessons are interactive and the children always enjoy their visits.

A Few Reminders For The Start Of The School Year:

Drop off and pick up times

The official school opening hours are from 8.45am until 2.50pm. Children should arrive as close to 8.30am as possible. Although teachers are often here much earlier, they are busy preparing for the school day and are not actively supervising the children.

All children need to be collected or to walk home promptly after the school bell has rung. The junior playground is not supervised after school, so this is not a safe place for your child. If you need after school supervision for your children, the Resource Centre runs an after school care programme on the school site.

<u>Parking</u>

The children's safety is paramount to us all, so we need to take special care when children are dropped off and picked up. There are visitors' car parking spaces for parents to the right of the school. The pull in outside rooms 1 and 2 is for drop off only and is patrolled by a council parking officer. Please take care not to block the neighbour's driveway if you are using the drop off area.

Extra parking at drop off and pick up times is usually available at St Peter's Church on Beach Road and the Bowling Club on Park Road. Although these are not car parks open to the general public, the church and the club are happy for you to use their parking to drop off and pick up as long as they don't have a function on. We are extremely lucky in Katikati that we have a very supportive local community, please respect the good will they show us.

Sun Safety

Please remember that your child needs to have a sun hat with a wide brim at school this term. Hats are available for purchase from the school office priced at \$14. The sun at this time of year can be very fierce even on cloudy days, so please make sure that if your child burns easily that they come to school wearing sun lotion. We do have sun lotion at school for your child to apply during the day, please make the class teacher aware if your child has an allergy to the lotion.

Uniform

We want our children to be proud to belong to Katikati Primary School, an important part of this is wearing the correct uniform. Please remember that the children need to be wearing one of our Katikati Primary School T-shirts with the school logo and that on the bottom they should be wearing a skirt, shorts or trousers which are plain navy, blue or black. If any families need assistance with uniform, we have our second hand uniform store open on Mondays from 8.15 – 8.30am in the back of the school hall or you can have a quiet word with your child's class teacher. Please be aware that Smartwatches are not allowed at school.

We are making a change to our uniform tops. Over time we will phase out the green and yellow polo shirts and replace them with a smart new design. Both the old and new t-shirt designs are very welcome to be worn this year. The new design will be gradually introduced at the Warehouse as stock of our traditional design are sold out.

Remember that Fridays are still house t-shirt days and children are welcome to wear their house shirts each Friday. More information regarding this will be in our next newsletter.

Disabled Parking

Please leave all of our disabled parking spaces clear unless you have a disabled badge. We have children at our school with special needs whose families depend on these spaces.

School Buses

Please remember if your child is going on the bus they must be registered online at www.katikati.easybus.nz.

This is to ensure they are on the bus list to be marked off each day and the bus company knows how many buses are needed for each run.

- RHYTHM AND PERCUSSION (RAP): For children aged 5-7 years. A fun program, designed for beginner students in music, to expand the childrens' natural rhythm and listening skills by using and exploring a wide variety of untuned and tuned percussion instruments, and movement to music.
- **UKULELE:** For children aged 6 years + Students must have a ukulele at home plus a clearfile to <u>bring to school each</u> lesson day. (School provides ukuleles during lessons)
- RECORDER: For children aged 6 years + Students must have their own recorder and clearfile to bring to school each lesson day.
- GUITAR: For children aged 8 years + Students must have their own guitar at home plus a clearfile to bring to school each lesson day (School provides guitars during lessons)
- **KEYBOARD:** For children aged 7 years + Students must have their own keyboard at home and a clearfile to bring to school each lesson day. (School provides keyboards during lessons)
- DRUMS: For children aged 8 years + No drum kit required but drumsticks needed.
- MARIMBA: For children aged 8 years +. A clearfile is required to bring to school each lesson day. Practice at home could be done on a keyboard or glockenspiel.
- CHOIR: For all ages A clearfile is required to bring to school each lesson day.



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

What is the Seasons for Growth Program?

Seasons for Growth is for children (6-12yrs) experiencing change and loss through family separation; loss, death, imprisonment, or illness of someone they care about; relocation and immigration; living away in out-of-home care; or natural disasters. Seasons for Growth is based on the belief that change and loss are part of life, and grief is a normal response to these losses. This 8-week program supports children to develop the skills and attitudes to understand and respond well to experiences of change and loss. The program offers children a safe place to come together in small groups and share their experiences. Participants learn that they are not alone in their experience of change and loss and learn skills that help them adapt. Many children enjoy the program so much, they want to do it again!

Level 2: 9-10 years - Katikati Primary School-Fridays-1:40PM Level 3: 1-12 years - Katikati Primary School-Mondays-3PM
