

<u>Junior School Trip to the Mines:</u> Our first set of junior classes headed out to the Waihi Mines today. Ned's Mindset Mission: Remember that NED's Mindset Mission will perform at our school this Friday. It is a free show that the whole school will be able to go and enjoy. NED's message and memorable friends inspire students, promote academic achievement and support our school goals. Irlens Testing: Irlen Syndrome is the brain's inability to process specific wavelengths of light. An Irlen brain has to work hard to process. The whole body is affected, whenever the eyes are open. Letters may be blurry, or shift, swirl or fade. Because it requires effort to bring words into focus and see clearly, free from distortion, it can cause headaches, eye strain and tiredness. If a child is identified with Irlens, they then select their coloured plastic overlay which is placed over books. This then allows that information to arrive at the same time and be processed without over- activity in the brain. There are three trained Irlens assessors in our community; Linda McMurry, Rochelle Kean and Rachel Reynolds who screen children from Year 3 up.

If you have noticed these symptoms please contact your child's teacher by FRIDAY 18TH AUGUST to request a free screening to be done at Katikati Primary School. One of the assessors will contact you regarding this.

<u>School Discos:</u> I wanted to say a huge thank you to our Parents of the School Group for organising the school discos last week. Our POTs members are highly dedicated and do a massive amount for our school. The children had a great time and the funds raised will go straight back to rewards for the children.

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

Treatment of Minor Conditions from Community Pharmacy

A minor ailment service will be available at your local Bay of Plenty community pharmacy during the winter of 2023.

To be eligible for a FREE pharmacist consultation, advice, treatment or referral; patients must meet either of these criteria:

- Children under 14 years of age
- Māori or Pacific people
- Hold a valid community services card.
- A whanau member of an eligible patient with the same condition

Conditions to be treated include:

- · Acute Diarrhoea or dehydration
- Scabies
- Eye inflammation/infections
- · Eczema/Dermatitis

- · Minor skin infections
- · Headlice
- · Pain and fever

A pharmacist at your local community pharmacy will be able to provide you with advice about your health condition, appropriate treatment options and advice on whether you should see your GP or healthcare provider.

Appointments are not required.
