Keeping our Children Safe:

School Drop Off Zone - Please take note of the regulations regarding the school loading zone which is outside the back of Rooms 1 and 2. Between 8 and 9.00 in the morning and 2.30 and 3.30 in the afternoon, these zones are for picking up and dropping children off only. Vehicles should not be parked here during these times and no one should be waiting for more than 5 minutes for their child. These rules are in place to try and keep our children safe and to keep traffic flowing. If you need a place to park up, we are extremely

fortunate that both the church and the bowling club are happy for you to use their spaces, as long as they don't have a function on. If they do, please be respectful, we would hate to lose the goodwill of the club or the church and be no longer welcome to park on their grounds.

Maths Competition: 11 students took part.



Our All Stars Award is the highest honour children can earn at our school. These awards are presented at the Year 6 graduation or the end of year assemblies for our younger students. Once they have completed their Gold Award, children will be given a booklet to bring home. The booklet details what they have to do in order to earn their All Stars Award. The activities will take about 6 weeks to complete and are all geared at demonstrating our school values. Children are challenged with tasks such as: setting up games for younger children at playtimes; helping out in our school library; making sure our school is free of litter and (one that will be very popular with whānau) undertaking chores to help out at home. Once the children have completed these tasks, their booklet will be signed off and they will become one of our All Stars.
