We look forward to another great year in 2023 – and together with your support building the case for better investment in our tamariki.

Welcome to all the new families who have enrolled over the last two weeks, we are really pleased to have you join our school. <u> Arriving on Time</u>

School starts at 8.45am. It is very important that children get to class on time in the morning. If they are late they miss out on valuable learning time and disturb the learning for their classmates. Teachers are in their classrooms from 8.15am in the morning, children can arrive anytime after this. We recommend that children get to class no later than 8.30 so that they can put their bags away and get their pens and books ready for their learning. It gives them a chance to touch base with their teacher and to get a piece of toast if they would like to. Please help to set your child up for success with their day at school by making sure they arrive on time.

The children are going to miss out on a range of learning and fun activities if they don't have their hat. Any wide brimmed hat is acceptable. Hats can also be purchased from the school office.
