#### Paid Union Meeting

Teachers in our school will be attending a paid union meeting on the afternoon of June 13th in the run up to the re-negotiation of their collective agreement. The meetings will discuss the teachers' Time 4 Tamariki | Wāwāhi Tahā campaign, which aims to win smaller class sizes, more support for high needs students, better recognition of cultural skills, greater job security for our essential relievers and to fairly value and recognise teachers' work.

Our union, NZEI Te Riu Roa, has scheduled online meetings to minimise disruption to teaching and learning and our school will aim to ensure the least disruption to your children's learning while upholding the right of teachers to participate in their union meeting.

In order to do this, our school will be open for instruction on the morning of the 13th, however we will only have a skeleton staff remaining in the afternoon. If you are able to support us by picking your children up at 1.00pm, we would be very appreciative. A permission slip has been sent home today. Many thanks for supporting our teachers.

#### Reporting to Parents

Close communication between home and school is very important for children's success. Over the years we have been adapting our reporting processes to ensure that we meet the needs of our families. Twice a year you will receive a written report to let you know how your child is progressing, the next report is due at the end of this term. Since we started sending out the written reports twice a year, we found that attendance at formal parent teacher interviews declined, so we have adapted to meet needs.

Your child's teacher will contact you if they think your child is not making expected progress and will let you know some ways you can help at home, so that together we can accelerate your child's progress. Parents and caregivers are also very welcome to make an appointment to see their child's class teacher at any time during the year. This can be done by emailing the class teacher for an appointment time (staff emails are available on our website) or by ringing the school office. Appointments are welcome if you would like to talk about your child's progress or about anything that is happening outside of school that you think might impact your child. We are always here to help if we can.
