This week our **ā**konga are celebrating Tongan Language Week, Uike K**ātoanga'i 'o e Lea Faka-Tonga. This year's theme is 'E tu'uloa** 'a e Lea faka-Tongá 'o ka lea'aki 'i 'api, siasí (lotú), mo e nofo-'ak**āingá',** which means the Tongan Language will be sustainable if used at home, church and in the wider community.

This is a time we celebrate our school's diversity by recognising the language spoken by a large number of our Katikati community. Children may learn Tongan songs, numbers, greetings, a Tongan legend or be involved in art projects that reflect the Tongan culture.

We are also looking forward to Te wiki o te reo Māori which takes place next week between the 11th and 17th Hepetema. Kia Kaha te reo Māori is the theme for this year's Māori Language Week meaning making the language stronger.
