
<u>Covid Update:</u> We are really pleased to say that we have very few cases of Covid connected to the school at present. As you will have heard, the government has made changes to the requirements surrounding Covid which came into effect at midnight last night. The major changes which impact schools are:

- 1. The removal of the requirement for household contacts to isolate. Instead, they will be asked to test for COVID-19 for five days.
- 2. Masks are no longer required on public transport or school transport and in line with other mask changes, they are no longer strongly recommended in school settings.
- 3. Positive cases remain legally required to isolate for seven days. Anyone who is symptomatic, including household contacts, should stay at home and get tested for COVID-19.

Celebrating Language and Culture

At Katikati Primary School we are very proud of the range of languages spoken by our tamariki and their whānau. We have a number of children who are bilingual, which is an amazing skill. Over the last two weeks, we have been celebrating Uike Kātoanga'i 'o e lea faka-Tonga and te Wiki o te reo Māori.





Last week was Uike K**ātoanga'i 'o e lea faka**-Tonga (Tonga Language Week). The theme for the week was Ke Tu'uloa 'a e lea faka-Tonga 'i Aotearoa, which means Sustaining the Tonga Language in Aotearoa.

This week is Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori. Kia Kaha te reo Māori is the theme for this year's Māori Language Week. 'Kia Kaha' means 'be strong'. To assist us in making the Māori language strong we have been using this week to check in with our Māori pronunciation and to learn some new phrases. There will be legends, art, competitions and sports for our tamariki to enjoy as well. We will round the week off with a performance by our kapa haka group.
