<u>Comedy Hoedown:</u> On behalf of the school I would like to say a huge thank you to Ben Hurley and our fabulous POTS team for organising our comedy fundraiser last Saturday. It was a great night. Alongside Ben were Justine Smith and Tony Lyall who were very brave interacting with our Katikati locals. We really appreciate them coming along to help us raise money for the school. Our POTS team did a fabulous job organising the event, you can imagine how much time and hard work went in on their part, we are really grateful. Thank you to everyone who came along to help us raise funds for ICT equipment for our children.

Paid Union Meeting: On the afternoon of the 21st November, the NZEI (the primary teachers' union) are holding a meeting which our staff members are legally entitled to attend. Much of the teachers' campaign is focussed on getting a better deal at school for your children - for example campaigning for increased school staffing levels, which would reduce class sizes and enable us to run more specialist programmes. Our school will be open for instruction on that afternoon but we will only have a skeleton staff remaining. If you are able to support us by picking your children up at 12.30pm on that date, we would be very appreciative. You do not need to sign your child out through the school office, there will be a sheet available in your child's classroom for this purpose. A permission slip has been sent home with your child today. Thanks again for supporting our teachers to provide the very best outcomes for your children.

<u>Special Visitor:</u> We were really pleased to have a visit from Stacey Roche last week. A selection of our Year 6 students got to listen to Stacey and ask questions. Stacey is a paralympian and published author who used to attend Katikati Primary School. She spoke to the children about how her determination and positive attitude helped her to get to the Olympics. She shared some stories and memories of her time at our school and really inspired the children to follow their dreams and to work hard to accomplish their aspirations. We were honoured that she came to visit.

<u>Attendance Texts:</u> When a child is away and we have not been notified about it, we send home a text message to remind you to contact us. If you receive one of these, all you have to do is reply to the text with the reason your child is away. The text reply will come back to us and we can give your child a code. If you don't reply, the code will turn into a truancy code. It will only take you a couple of seconds to reply to the text and will save us all lots of time. Thank you for your assistance.

Year Six Graduation:

We are looking forward to celebrating with our Year 6 students at their Graduation on the 14th December. More details will come out closer to the time but please put the date in your diary. The event will be held between 9.00am and 11.00am. Cups will be presented for a range of achievements and our prizegiving will end with the Y6 students receiving their graduation certificates. Families of children who are chosen for the cups will be contacted by staff before the event and we hope to see as many of you there as possible. With the help of our POTS group, there will also be an evening event for the Year 6 students on the same day, with dinner and a disco especially for them.
