We hope all families are connected to their child's seesaw account and have kept up to date with learning that was uploaded onto the site during Term 3. This platform will be used to showcase not only learning but reporting to you (whanau at home), replacing the formal report twice a year.



Reporting within a platform such as this makes it real and in the moment. You will be able to see an example of the learning happening or that has taken place, with a teacher comment alongside it. Students will be encouraged to develop agency within this learning environment and be encouraged to discuss their learning with you. By developing this, we hope to build a sense of ownership of learning amongst our tamariki. End of year reports will be uploaded to this platform at the end of term.
